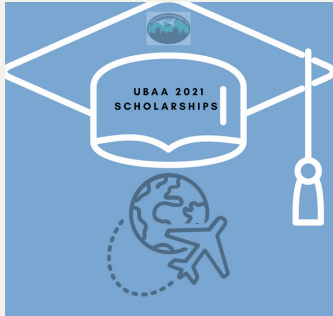
The 8th annual golf event, hosted at Stonebridge Golf Course on September 22, was the first in-person function the Association was able to hold since the beginning of the pandemic.

Earlier in May we chose our 2021 scholarship recipients. The applicant pool was truly awesome this year, making selections difficult, UBAA's scholarship committee landed on four amazing students, so let us take this opportunity to recognize and congratulate them.



First off, we have Hailey Honovich. Hailey is studying flight operations at Westminster College. She is currently pursuing her tailwheel endorsement, and is involved with the Women in Aviation and Ninety-Nines organizations. She is a full-time flight instructor with her CFI, CFII, and MEI. She is building flight time while also teaching future aviators.

Second, we have our second Westminster student, Jack Jorgenson. Jack is studying Aviation Flight Operations at Westminster College. First off, thank you UBAA for letting us tell you who we are and what we do.

Compassion Flight bridges the gap between home and health by providing free air transportation for people who need to access medical care and other essential services. The costs of all flights are donated. There is never a charge for a Compassion Flight mission. - In addition to medical flights, we arrange transportation for other humanitarian purposes, such as individuals and families escaping domestic violence; injured military personnel taking part in therapeutic programs offered by veterans' organizations; and prospective parents hoping to adopt a child. Missions are coordinated by Angel Flight West who bring together all persons in need with our flights.

Compassion flight was organized just a year ago in February of 2020. My name is Kim Tingey and, along with my two sons Aaron and Zach who are both CFIs and commercial rated pilots, we've always had a desire to help others. I spent 21 years with the Air Force flying on the KC-135 Stratotanker. We have combined our love of flying and helping with Compassion Flight. We are a 501(c)3 nonprofit organization. We currently fly a Cessna 182 and are looking to upgrade to a Cessna 206. We'd love to help any of you or we are always looking for donations to counter the cost of our flying.
